



Chris Riddell, the 2015-2017 UK Children's Laureate, is a prolific writer and illustrator whose work is familiar to both children and adults. He is known especially for his distinctive line drawings with their clever caricature, fascinating detail and often enchanting fantasy elements.

His books have won a number of major prizes, including the 2001, 2004 and 2016 CILIP Kate Greenaway Medals. His work includes the *Goth Girl* series, the *Ottoline* series and the picture books *The Emperor of Absurdia* and *Alienography*. The first *Goth Girl* novel won the Costa Children's Book Award in 2013.

In addition to his children's books, Chris is a renowned political cartoonist whose work appears in *The Observer, The Literary Review* and *The New Statesman*. He lives in Brighton with his family. Chris has recently become an Ambassador for Amnesty International UK.
